FROGLETS

What is Froglets Club?

We provide high quality, exciting before and after school care for our children in the Family Room at St Philip's Marsh Nursery School. The children gave it the name "Froglets".

What are the opening and closing times?

Breakfast Club starts at 7.45 am and children will be taken to their classrooms at 9.00 am.

After School Club starts at 3.15 pm. The children will be collected by staff from their classrooms and taken to After School Club. They must be collected by a parent/carer **no later than 5.45 pm**.

Who can use Froglets?

Froglets is intended to be an inclusive and accessible service for all children in the School. Places are allocated on a first come, first served basis.

Who will look after my child?

Froglets staff are qualified and experienced in order to maintain the high quality of care that the School provides. Some of the Froglets staff work in the classrooms during the day and therefore will be familiar to the children.

What will my child do in Froglets?

Breakfast Club

When the children arrive in the morning they will be offered a healthy breakfast. They will then be able to play until it's time to go to class.

After School Club

The children will be able to play until it's time for tea. After a healthy tea, children can choose free play or take part in an adult-organised activity e.g. cookery, painting. At 5.30 pm the children will be able to engage in a relaxing activity e.g. listening to a story, singing or, occasionally, a DVD.

What will my child eat?

The School believes in promoting healthy lifestyles and therefore the children are offered a healthy meal during each session. Breakfast includes toast, cereal and milk or water to drink. The After School Club meal is cooked on site, details of which are displayed in the Family Room. If a child has special dietary requirements, this will be catered for. Alternatively you can provide a packed lunch.

How will I know my child is safe?

Froglets is run under the guidance of the School's Health & Safety Policy and Safeguarding and Child Protection Policy and Procedures. The building has secure gates, coded door pads, monitors and cameras to protect the premises.

How much does it cost?

Breakfast Club costs £5.00 per session (including food) and After School Club costs £11.00 per session (excluding food). One month's notice will be given to parents/carers regarding price changes.

How do I pay?

Parents/carers will be given monthly invoices in advance. Invoices must be paid within 14 days either by cash or cheque or payment can be made to Bristol City Council, details of which are printed on the bottom of each invoice. We also welcome childcare vouchers from several companies (please speak to staff on Reception for further information).

Will I have to book in advance?

Yes. We ask parents to book regular monthly sessions.

What if I need to cancel my child's place?

If your child is ill or absent for a few days, you will be expected to pay for their regular sessions. If you wish to end your child's regular sessions before the end of term, we ask for one month's prior notice.

Can I get help with fees?

Unfortunately, we cannot offer subsidised places. However, if you are working over 16 hours per week, you may be entitled to Child Care Tax Credits which can cover up to 70% of the cost. If you are studying or looking for work, there may be bursaries or grants available. We can offer practical support to parents who want to make claims – please speak to staff on Reception for further information.

Can I use my 30 hour code?

The government offers 30 hours free childcare for 3-4 year olds if you earn more than the equivalent of 16 hours at the national living wage or minimum wage per week. The 30 hours can be used to include Breakfast Club and After School Club (please note – if you use the After School Club as part of your 30 hours you will have to provide/pay for a meal).
